EVENING CONCERTS

For the evening performances the junior children will need to be at St. Barnabas Church from 5.40p.m. The children are expected to wear their school uniform. Please ensure that pre-school children sit on an adult's knee so we can accommodate as many people as possible. There is also standing room at the back and slightly down each side. Whilst the concert is on please remember to turn mobile phones off. Please remember that due to fire regulations at the church this year, only one evening performance can be watched, even though the children will be required to take part in BOTH performances. After the 6pm performance the church will be emptied before the 6.50pm performance queue will be allowed to take their seats.

Again there will be a collection at the end of the concert in aid of local, national and international charities as chosen by the school council so please bring any loose change.

Please complete and return the permission slip on the previously sent letter so we know how many children are taking part in the Junior evening concert and how your child will be collected at the end of the concert. No child has permission to walk home on their own after the evening concert.
